## RE-ORGANIZATIONAL MEETING OF THE BIG STONE COUNTY BOARD January 7, 2025

The Big Stone County Board of Commissioners met in the Commissioners' Room at 8:30 AM on Tuesday, January 7, 2025. Vice Chairman Athey called the meeting to order with Commissioners Zimmel, Klages, Radermacher and Thyne present. Also present were Dillon Dwyer of the Ortonville Independent and Coordinator Pam Rud. The Pledge of Allegiance followed.

Upon call for nominations for Board Chairman, Commissioner Athey was nominated. Following 2 calls for further nominations, motion by Radermacher, seconded by Zimmel and carried unanimously to cast a unanimous ballot for Commissioner Athey for Chairman.

Chairman Athey called for nominations for Vice Chairman. Commissioner Zimmel was nominated. Following 2 calls for further nominations, motion by Klages, seconded by Radermacher and carried unanimously to cast a unanimous ballot for Commissioner Zimmel for Vice Chairman.

Motion by Klages, seconded by Radermacher and carried unanimously to approve the minutes of the December 17<sup>th</sup> regular meeting.

Motion by Thyne, seconded by Radermacher and carried unanimously to approve the agenda.

WHEREAS, M.S. §118A.02, subd. 1(a) states "The governing body of each government entity shall designate, as a depository of its funds, one or more financial institutions."; and

WHEREAS, M.S. §118A.02, subd. 1(b)(2) allows the County board to authorize the Auditor/Treasurer to make investments of funds under M.S. §118A.01 to 118A.06 or other applicable law.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Big Stone County Board of Commissioners designates as depositories the following financial institutions and designates the following as brokers and authorized investment holders:

- Minnwest Bank of Ortonville
- CenBank of Ortonville
- Frandsen Bank & Trust of Clinton
- First Independent Bank of Beardsley
- Star Bank of Graceville
- MAGIC Fund, managed by PFM Asset Management

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County Board of Commissioners authorizes the Auditor-Treasurer to make investments of funds under M.S. §118A.01 to 118A.06 or other applicable law at any one or more of the above.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the County Auditor-Treasurer is hereby authorized to act and serve as county agent on any County accounts set up or active at any of the above financial institutions, brokers, or investment holders.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the above designations and authority conferred shall be and remain in full force and effect until written notice of any amendment or revocation thereof shall have been delivered to and received by the financial institution, broker, or investment holder at each location where an account is maintained and the financial institution, broker, or investment holder shall be indemnified and held harmless from any loss suffered or any liability incurred by it in continuing to act in accordance with this resolution

Motion by Zimmel, seconded by Thyne and carried unanimously to adopt the following resolution:

## 2025-02

WHEREAS, Minnesota Statute 471.38, allows for the use of electronic funds transfers as a means of making various payments; and

WHEREAS, a local government may make an electronic funds transfer for the following:

- a. For a claim for a payment from an imprest payroll bank account or investment of excess money;
- b. For a payment of tax or aid anticipation certificates;
- c. For a payment of contributions to pension or retirement fund;
- d. For vendor payments; and

e. For payment of bond principal, bond interest and fiscal agent service charge from the debt redemption fund; and

WHEREAS, the County Board shall annually delegate the authority to make electronic funds transfers.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Big Stone County Board delegates County Auditor-Treasurer Michelle Knutson the authority to make electronic fund transfers.

Knutson reviewed gravel tax revenue and stated that the 2025 aggregate gravel tax budget is included with the overall county budget that was approved in December so no separate motion will be needed. However, motion by Klages, seconded by Radermacher and carried unanimously to authorize Engineer Jorden Roggenbuck to do restoration to some areas of county owned gravel pits using restoration funds.

Auditor-Treasurer Knutson reviewed the 2024 ditch loan activity with the Board and noted payments were done as internal transactions.

Motion by Radermacher, seconded by Thyne and carried unanimously to adopt the following resolution:

Family Services Director Laura Laub presented the 2025 Someplace Safe Parenting time purchase of service contract. Motion by Klages, seconded by Thyne and carried unanimously to approve the contract as presented.

County Engineer Jorden Roggenbuck presented information on the Monarch CCAA project and request for payment for enrollment in the Candidate Conservation Agreement with Assurances for the Monarch Butterfly. Motion by Radermacher, seconded by Klages and carried with Commissioner Athey voting nay.

Rud presented 2025 Board dates. Motion by Zimmel, seconded by Thyne and carried unanimously to approve the dates as presented.

Rud presented the 2025 Operating Guidelines for consideration. Motion by Klages, seconded by Radermacher and carried to approve the guidelines.

Work session included discussion on the upcoming drainage conference as well
as cannabis ordinances and working with the various cities and Public Health to develop
ordinances. This will be a topic at a future work session.
